I was touched during my last visit to this church. A small group of 15 individuals met for the Sunday service. Prior to the service, I had the pleasure of teaching part of an ongoing

course, "How to Study the Bible." I was encouraged by the great questions and genuine interest of the study participants. Later, in the worship service, one older lady asked that we sing a song that, loosely translated, states, "Where would I be if you had not saved me?" I was touched, reflecting on where I would be had I not known Christ as my Saviour, and also moved as I thought of the thankfulness expressed by this woman, holding onto Jesus as her all in all. Please pray for this group and others like it. So many small groups of believers meet week after week, desiring to enjoy life in Christ in a society that still, in general, dismisses Christ from everyday life. To be honest, at times this frustrates me, and at other times it just breaks my heart. Like Jesus said, "... how often I would gather you to myself, like a mother hen her chicks..."
