

training and releasing leaders

One of the areas I've appreciated about my involvement with World Team over the years is the emphasis on continuous learning. This value affects each field worker, and spills over to effect those we work to reach, and later disciple.

I've been blessed in the past year to grow in a variety of ways.

Albert Ehmann, former International Director for World Team, agreed to mentor and disciple me via Skype. We

interact regularly, and then, in the period between sessions, I dig into the areas of growth he's challenged me in. What a joy to repent of habits that betray my hope in Christ, experience new victories in Christ, and develop new skills for the ministry!

This fall I was also privileged to take in a FOCUS Workshop. This enhances my "toolbox" of resources, allowing for more effective service in the churches I seek to assist. The beauty of this revolves around the reproductive element of the material. I learned this material and now am equipped to teach it to others, with a view to seeing churches in Canada maximize their potential for global impact! So, I can receive training, be released to train others, and in turn release these to train even more! All of this moves us towards reaching the unreached for Jesus, beginning a whole new cycle of training and releasing!

mobilization = leading

WHEN I first considered my role in mobilization for World Team Canada, I asked, "What does this have to do with the leadership preparation God has given me?" There was no clear thread of continuity between the ministry in Spain and the new responsibilities in Canada.

AS GOD opened doors of influence with churches and individuals across Canada, a pattern began to emerge. Frankly, leadership included areas that I'd not previously considered!

IN THE FALL of 2012, Bill Allan asked me to provide leadership for the overall WTC mobilization team. This creates opportunities to challenge, train, encourage, and evaluate the efforts of others on the team. Through their feedback and a year of experience, I've grown into this leadership role.

OVER THE PAST years, another door for leadership opened at Emmanuel Bible College (EBC). EBC students are required to serve in "Field Ed" (a ministry that integrates their learning). As a "Field Ed Supervisor" I receive the chance to speak into students' lives, encourage them in their learning, and influence them to consider cross-cultural ministry.

A MORE RECENT responsibility at World Team created a window of unique leadership opportunity. As World Team plans into the future, a number of people are dedicating time to consider innovative ways to get more people to reaching the unreached with the Gospel. My role? Group leader!
